

## Spot Birds In Your Garden

### Garden Birds

- Birds come to your garden to eat, drink and collect materials for their nests
- They eat insects and berries
- Water is very important for the birds to drink
- When they eat berries, it helps spread seeds through their droppings
- In the morning, the birds sing. This is called the morning chorus and can start as early as 4am and last several hours.
