What objects, shapes, or characters can you see?

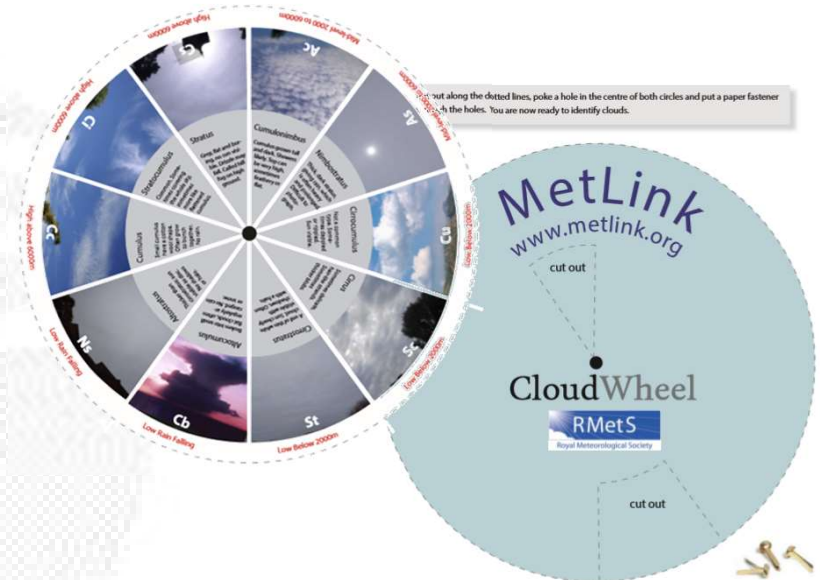


What story can you see in the clouds?
